Flat Shoals Estates homeowners voice concerns

Residents of the Flat Shoals Homeowners Association gathered at the Piccadilly Restaurant on Godby Road for a two-hour meeting, Saturday, March 14. They heard from Mighty 6 District Commissioner Emma I. Darnell and discussed multiple issues that are impacting their neighborhood.

During the meeting, convened by Alfred Falligan, co-president of the association, members voiced concerns about crime, street lights and other issues.

“Businesses will not come into a community where it’s not safe, I’d like to see more safety in our community,” said Alan Rosser, a longtime resident and business owner.

Rosser and his wife, Patricia have a 15-year-old son, and have owned and operated a child daycare center in the Mighty 6 District for 14 years. They moved into their current neighborhood nearly 16 years ago. They noted that they’re looking for street repairs and safety to be given greater attention.

“My greatest concern is about the children, the younger children coming up,” said Ms. Rosser. “I want them to grow up in a safe and healthy environment.”

Fulton County Police Officer Maureen Smith also addressed the group on ways to improve safety in the neighborhood.

“We are committed to GETTING IT DONE TOGETHER,” said Commissioner Darnell, who answered several questions after her presentation.

The meeting also drew residents from other nearby neighborhoods, who also asked questions and voiced concerns. Each resident was given a Constituent Comment Card to provide greater detail of their individual concerns.

“We are pleased that she came out,” said Falligan. “It was a chance for her to know us as a community and to hear her views, and she hear our concerns for the Flat Shoals Homeowners area.”

“A few of us have been telling our homeowners that being actively involved is the only way to get things done. Commissioner Darnell coming out reemphasizing that will help us as a HOA community to get more people involved in forming a better community for us.” Falligan said.

Highway 92 top concern for Hampton Oaks, LeJardin residents

Darnell hears requests for traffic light at dangerous intersection

Nearly 100 residents, homeowners, and neighbors from Hampton Oaks and LeJardin subdivisions attended a community meeting, Monday, March 23, to meet and discuss concerns with Mighty 6 District Commissioner Emma I. Darnell. The intersection of State Highway 92 and Butner/Ridge Road is considered a major risk to the safety of these communities. Citizens expressed the need for a traffic light at the Butner/Ridge intersection and at the exit from the Hampton Oaks subdivision at Misty Dawn Drive. Citizens also expressed the need for strict enforcement of speed-limit laws on Highway 92.
